



PEGO Bursary Application Process

The PEGO bursary provides financial assistance to eligible dependent children of current PEGO members enrolled in an accredited engineering and/or land surveyor program at a Canadian university. This bursary, up to a maximum of \$2000, will be offered to qualified students for the equivalent of a maximum of four years of full-time enrolment, not necessarily consecutive, at a Canadian University.

ELIGIBILITY:

1. The applicant must be a dependent of a current PEGO member in good standing.
2. The dependent children must initially satisfy the entrance requirements of their chosen degree program in engineering or land surveying in Canada.
3. The bursary shall be tenable for courses taken for credit towards an accredited engineering or land surveying degree in Canada for a maximum of four years full- time (not necessarily consecutive). Application for this bursary may be made by November 15 of the academic year the application is submitted.

Dependent means child of the member/employee, less than 26 years of age and dependent for support on such member/employee. The following will also be considered children of the employee: persons the employee is adopting; stepchildren of the member/employee; and persons related to the employee by blood or marriage, or for whom the member/employee is legal guardian. The restriction of 25 years does not apply to a physically or mentally disabled child who is over 25 years of age and who had this condition and was a dependent of the employee before the age of 26.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

For Initial Applications:

1. Complete the PEGO Bursary Application
2. The student must provide proof of acceptance into the program for the first year
3. The student must provide proof of enrolment
4. Students are required to submit a 500-word submission on the value of engineers and/or land surveyors in today's society.

For Subsequent Applications:

1. Complete the PEGO Bursary Application
2. The student must provide proof of enrolment for each subsequent year to receive the subsequent payments.

PROCESS

1. Students who are not eligible for the bursary will be informed in writing that they are not eligible.
2. Details regarding eligibility are the personal information of the student and will not be disclosed to a third party without the consent of the student.
3. The maximum number of payments, which any student can receive, is equal to four. The value of the bursary for an academic year is equal to \$500.
4. Payments will be provided to students in December of the academic year the application is submitted.

***Academic year refers to the period between September to April only, and does not include summer or intersession courses.**
